OPEN CLASS RULES

Also see Exhibit building rules.

All entries must be entered between 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Tuesday, August 1, North door. The Exhibit building will be closed to the public during judging on Wednesday, August 2. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST BE RESIDENTS OF ANTELOPE COUNTY OR A COUNTY BORDERING ANTELOPE COUNTY.

An exhibitor may enter only one (1) entry per class number. All articles must be finished since last fair. No person will be allowed to enter more than 30 TOTAL entries in Open Class, including flowers. If there is only one entry in a class the judge will decide whether the article is worthy of a prize. All articles entered will be displayed or hung on display racks. *AGE must be written on All Entries*. Exhibitors must be at least 4 years of age on January 1, 2023. Judges expect projects to be completed by the Exhibitor. Judges watch for age appropriateness of project. At Judges' discretion, the project could be disqualified.

Release time is 3:00-4:30 p.m. on Sunday. All exhibits must be out of the building by 5:00 p.m. The Ag Society will not be responsible for any items not picked up during release time. Anything leftover can be picked up on Monday during post fair clean-up or by calling the fair office at 402-887-5252 to coordinate a time.

Best in County recognition for quilts or other textiles is not known at the time of printing.

RULES & REGULATIONS OPEN CLASS ENTRIES-ANIMALS

There will be no stall fee & feed shall be furnished by exhibitor & stalls cleaned after showing. All open class exhibitors will report to the superintendent when bringing in their exhibits on entry day. The superintendent will enter each entry in the judge's book. All exhibitors are responsible to see that their entries are properly entered in the judge's book. All Open Class animals' entries must have an entry tag filled out by exhibitor at time of entering exhibit. Superintendents will have access to tags. Tags are due to the Superintendent by showtime.

ENTRIES

Space cannot be guaranteed on Open Class entries. Please let the Superintendent know if you wish to keep your animal at the fair when entering it.

ALL ENTRIES, EXCEPT LIVESTOCK, ARE CONFINED TO RESIDENTS OF ANTELOPE COUNTY AND COUNTIES BORDERING ANTELOPE COUNTY ages 4 and over. The livestock entries are confined to residents of Nebraska if stall or pen space is available.

All entries will be made in strict compliance with this official premium list and awards made in compliance there with. Exhibitors therefore are responsible to have their livestock and articles properly entered.

All animals entered in Breeding Stock Classes shall be registered, or eligible to be registered, in their respective breed association. No animal can be entered in more than one class except a horse.

PREMIUMS

Where there is no competition in a class, first prize awards will be made only if the judge says the entry is worthy of first premium, unless otherwise stated. Ribbons awarded to all participants in each class on merit of blue, red, or white award. No participation ribbons. Blue ribbons or cards denote first premiums, red ribbons or cards denote second premium, and white ribbons or cards denote third premium.

Superintendents will attach the premium tags as soon as the judges have rendered a decision.

All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by deposit of \$5.00, which will be forfeited if protest is not sustained. Such protests must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be filed with the secretary by 12:00 noon on the last day of the fair.

ONLY Champion and reserve champion 4-H and FFA livestock may compete in open class for grand championship honors.

All PREMIUMS will be paid in full unless by unavoidable cause receipts are insufficient, in which case they will be pro-rated and paid accordingly. Premiums will be paid as promptly as possible.

SUPERINTENDENTS

Superintendents must be on the grounds at the opening of the fair to receive all exhibits in their divisions, check that all entry forms are completely filled out and see that all exhibits are arranged properly for exhibition. Each superintendent is directed to familiarize him/herself with their duties as keeping proper records, appointing assistants, and returning all books and records to their divisions. Livestock superintendents must check that all entry cards are filled out completely and must notify the exhibitors to bring the different classes into the show ring. Superintendents will have full & complete charge of everything in their departments & will be responsible for proper arrangement & management in their department.

ALL SUPERINTENDENTS MUST HELP JUDGES WHILE JUDGING IN THEIR DEPARTMENTS.

PEE WEE SHOWMANSHIP

Children ages **4 to 8** years of age only will be allowed to show animals in Pee Wee Showmanship with the discretion of the Superintendent. Exhibitor's age must be written on the entry tag for all animal entries. Weight limit for large animals, 6 months or younger, is no more than 350 pounds.

JUDGES

Judges will receive their books and enter upon the discharges of their duties at the direction of the department superintendent. No judge will be permitted to officiate in any class in which they are competing for a premium. Judges will not award any animal or article a premium unless in their judgment it is entitled to the premium awarded. Judges must not allow any person to interfere with their work. Judges shall place classes after the superintendent or clerk has found entries to be correct.

In order to accomplish one of the principal purposes of the fair, all judges will give reasons for their placing of each class.

NOTICE

The foregoing rules shall govern all classes except where special exceptions are given in any particular class. To avoid mistakes, read the rules and regulations carefully. Contact the secretary for more information if needed.

POLICE REGULATIONS

The county sheriff shall oversee the grounds and it shall be his duty, with the assistance of the police, to preserve order. The officers will be sworn in as conservators of the peace, and it shall be their duty to arrest any person creating disorder on the grounds or violating any of the rules of the society or laws of the state. Any policeman, employed day or night, which shall neglect the duty that has been assigned him or leave his beat without permission, shall forfeit all or part of his pay as the county sheriff may determine. The county sheriff must approve all claims for services as officers.

AUTO PARKING

It shall be the duty of the county sheriff and his assistants to supervise the parking of automobiles. All automobiles will be required to park in places designated by those in charge of parking, but the fair management assumes no obligation and no liability for any theft or damage that may occur.

ADVERTISING

Commercial Exhibitors in the pavilion may advertise at and distribute literature from their places of exhibit only.

All booth fees must be paid in advance & cover only one stand at the price named. Booths will be assigned on a first come first serve basis. Anyone wanting to change his or her booth assignment must find another booth to exchange with. The Ag Society will not change the booth assignment once assigned. Please contact Stacy for Pavilion information.

All privileges will be sold on the distinct understanding that the right of cancellation is reserved by the management of the fair for violation of the statutes of the state or the regulations of the society, and any or either of such violations by anyone shall work a forfeiture of this privilege without reimbursement.

No privileges will be granted for questionable or immoral shows, nor will any be permitted on the fairgrounds. Each person is expected to deal honestly with the public and any attempt to fraud or misrepresent will be considered cause for revocation of the privilege and forfeiture of money paid.

The pavilion will be open the following hours. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have their booth supervised during these hours. The Ag Society will not be responsible for exhibitor's displays

The pavilion contact person will have the authority to render decisions. Setup or displays will only be allowed during the hours posted below.

All dogs must be immunized for distemper before entering the show. When their age permits, all dogs must have had their rabies shot.
